Overview

Veterans who have died after a war or conflict may be officially commemorated.

The memorials are provided and maintained at the expense of Office of Australian War Graves (OAWG) and remain the property of the OAWG.

In order to ensure that all veterans are commemorated equally and uniformly, all memorials provided by the OAWG are uniform in design for each type of memorial and to the area of the particular cemetery where the memorial is to be placed.

Every headstone or plaque is inscribed (where known) with the person's:


- national emblem or Service badge
- name (initials and surname)
- service number (if applicable)
- · rank and unit
- · date of death
- · age at death (optional)
- religious emblem (optional)
- a personal inscription chosen by relatives (optional).



Official commemorations provided by the OAWG may not be altered or amended in any way.

Official Commemorations

The diagram below displays the process for receiving an official commemoration.

Commemoration Types

If you are deciding upon the post-war commemoration for a veteran, while the memorials are similar in many ways, there are some practical differences that may affect your choice, see below the three types of standard memorials that the OAWG provides.

Type of Commemoration	Description	Example
Cemetery	General Cemetery A standard concrete memorial, consisting of kerbing, infill, headstone and bronze plaque. Lawn Cemetery The OAWG must abide by the regulations of the cemetery involved. In all cases, where permitted, OAWG will provide and maintain a bronze plaque. If OAWG is not permitted to place a memorial plaque in a particular lawn cemetery, official commemoration would need to take place in an OAWG Garden of Remembrance (GRM).	
Ashes / Crematorium	OAWG will arrange for placement of the ashes in a wall niche or garden setting at the crematorium of choice by the family or executor. If the ashes have been scattered or are to be retained by the family, an OAWG GRM memorial only is provided.	
Garden of Remembrance (GRM)	A GRM memorial is provided as an alternative commemoration when the OAWG is either unable or not requested to provide official commemoration at the place of burial or cremation. The GRM memorial is a bronze plaque placed on a wall in a garden setting. OAWG has established Gardens of Remembrance in all capital cities, Townsville and Launceston. http://www.dva.gov.au/commems_oawg/OAWG/post_war_commemorations/gardens_remembrance/Pages/locations.aspx If a widow or family member is unable to visit the veteran's official memorial arrangements can be made for a photograph to be obtained.

Eligibility

Before a veteran can receive an official commemoration offer they must first be assessed as eligible.



Eligibility for a memorial is not established by OAWG but by the relevant State Office of the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA).

The table below outlines eligibility requirements for an official commemoration.

Veteran	Eligibility Requirements
War Dead	
World War I (4 August 1914 – 31 August 1921) World War II (3 September 1939 – 31 December 1947)	Death in Service from any cause during the war period. Death post-Service during the war period where death is attributable to Service
Member who died after World War II on operational service in an operational area or as a member of a United Nations' peacekeeping operation Death in Service whilst on operational (peacekeeping) service in the operational (peacekeeping) area during the period for the particular service in the operational area or as a member of a United Nations' peacekeeping operation Death in Service whilst on operational (peacekeeping) service in the operational area or as a member of a United Nations' peacekeeping operation area or as a member of a United Nations' peacekeeping operation area or as a member of a United Nations' peacekeeping operation area or as a member of a United Nations' peacekeeping operation operational (peacekeeping) area during the period for the particular service in the operational area or as a member of a United Nations' peacekeeping operation operational area or as a member of a United Nations' peacekeeping operation op	
'Warlike' Service	Death in Service whilst on 'Warlike' Service during the designated period of 'Warlike' Service specified in the <i>VEA</i> or the <i>MRCA</i> . Death during the specified period outside of the 'Warlike' area of operations from a condition incurred whilst on 'Warlike' Service in the area.
'Non-Warlike' Service	Death in Service whilst on 'Non-Warlike' Service during the designated period of 'Non-Warlike' Service specified in the <i>VEA</i> or the <i>MRCA</i> . Death during the specified period outside of the 'Non-Warlike' area of operations from a condition incurred whilst on 'Non-Warlike' Service in the area
Post-War / Conflict Dead	
Veterans who die after a war or after operational, peacekeeping, 'Warlike' or 'Non-Warlike' Service	For veterans seeking a determination under the <i>VEA</i> , death must be taken by the Repatriation Commission to have been war caused under <i>VEA</i> s8. For veterans seeking a determination under the <i>MRCA</i> , death must be attributable by the Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Commission to an occurrence on 'Warlike' or 'Non-Warlike' Service
Victoria Cross recipients	Recipient of the Victoria Cross. Cause of death is immaterial
Ex Prisoners of War	Former Prisoner of War. Cause of death is immaterial
Totally and Permanently Incapacitated veterans (Recipients of the VEA Special Rate Pension; recipients of the MRCA Special Rate Disability Pension)	In receipt of Special Rate (<i>VEA</i>) or Special Rate Disability (MRCA) Pension. The veteran must also have had operational, peacekeeping, 'Warlike' or 'Non-Warlike' service, but the TPI condition does not need to be related to such service. Cause of death is immaterial
Veterans with multiple	In receipt of the maximum rate of pension for multiple amputees under VEA

amputations as a result of service in war or conflict	s27. Cause of death is immaterial
Veterans in receipt of the Extreme Disablement Adjustment (EDA) under the VEA.	In receipt of the EDA. Cause of death is immaterial



If a veteran is not automatically eligible, but you believe that the death is attributable to their war service, an application can be made by writing to the Deputy Commissioner, DVA, at GPO Box 9998 in the State where the veteran was resident, requesting that the death be accepted as war related. If the application is successful, the veteran will then become eligible for official commemoration.



If you have a question about eligibility, please direct your enquiry in writing to your nearest DVA or VAN office.

Commemoration Offers

Once the veteran has been assessed as eligible, a letter of offer is sent.

You can respond to the offer in two ways:

Complete the acknowledgment application as supplied in the offer pack and return to the address indicated.

The <u>dva.gov.au</u> website allows you to respond to the offer by completing the acknowledgment application online.



You will need to have your offer reference number ready, located at the topic left of the Offer of Official Commemoration letter.

When completing your application, fields marked with a red asterisk (*) are mandatory.






If at this time you have chosen not to accept the official commemoration, you can change your mind at anytime by contacting the OAWG.

Select the Type of cemetery provided above, eg Lawn or Monumental. Enter the Section, Row and Grave number. Optional, select if you would like a Religious emblem and which one eg, None, Cross, Star or Crescent. Optional, in the Personal inscription fields, enter a personal message. The inscription can be two lines with a max of 40 characters per line. Select if there is a second interment planned.

6. Select **Yes** or **No** if the service and veteran details displayed on screen are correct or not.



If you have selected 'No', you can specify what details are incorrect and upload appropriate official evidence, eg discharge certificate.

- 7. Select **Yes** or **No** if you are the addressee, or responding on behalf of the addressee for the commemoration offer.
- 8. Select **Yes** or **No** if the contact details on the commemoration offer are correct.
- 9. If you selected **No** to the previous question, complete the **Given name(s)**, **Family name**, **Title**, **Gender** and **Relationship to veteran** fields.
- 10. Complete the following contact details.

Veterans' who have been assessed as eligible for an official commemoration can pre-select their commemoration preferences.


These preferences will be displayed in both the letter of offer and in the online offer response.

- 3. Click on the **Retrieve offer** button.
